LEGISLATIVE NOTES

Less than two weeks after cementing another major increase to the Pentagon budget, lawmakers began talking about going the opposite direction. An emerging deal between Speaker Kevin McCarthy and conservatives looks to exact deep spending cuts. This comes amid a partisan fight over the debt limit, compounding fears that overall spending is poised for a return to automatic reductions known as sequestration. Funding programs through temporary continuing resolutions, which carry over the previous year's levels and block new programs from getting started, is a long-running complaint of Pentagon brass. Many Republicans have sought to quash chatter of Pentagon cuts and instead look to make non-military reductions. -- Politico The 98th South Dakota Legislative Session began January 10. Eight bills have been referred to the House Military and Veterans Affairs Committee: HR 1037 to amend eligibility for admission to the state veterans' home, **HB 1039** to increase payment of tuition for members of the South Dakota National Guard from 50% to 100%, HR 1045 to increase the basic salary schedule for county veterans' service officers, HB 1046 to provide free tuition at Board of Technical Education institutions for family members of South Dakota National Guard disabled or deceased in the line of duty, HB 1051 to require counties to hire veteran service officers in proportion to the number of veterans residing in the county, **HB 1054** to provide a \$100 stipend for a private headstone for a deceased veteran, **HB 1065** to increase from \$100 to \$200 the amount payable by the state to erect headstones for deceased veterans. The last, HR 1052, to add surviving spouses to the \$150,000 property tax relief program for disabled veterans, was rejected. Three Senate bills have been referred to the Joint Committee on Appropriations: SB 12 to authorize construction of a National Guard vehicle maintenance shop in Watertown, SB 13 to authorize construction of an addition to the BG Dean Mann Readiness Center in Sioux Falls, and SB 14 to revise that legal description. SB 15 to accept Uniformed Services ID as proof for adding veteran designation to state license or ID card was passed by Senate Transportation. Senate Commemoration **801** honored the 75th anniversary of the Singing Legionnaires of American Legion Post 15 in Sioux Falls.

As noted in the January newsletter, after approximately two years as Larry Panning's assistant, we decided to realign responsibilities. We attended the annual SD American Legion Zoom meeting that primarily focused on VAVS. At that meeting, we were awarded our State Legion dollars, which are annually distributed for Veterans' special events or needs. Our local VAVS office held its 1st quarter meeting via Zoom, with various supporting groups and organizations attending. Discussion centered around financial donations, upcoming veterans events, and the current needs list (See the Post 15 website). National Salute to Veterans Patients week will be held Feb. 13-17.
