The Sioux Empire Fair is coming up August 5-13. We will need members for talking to the public about the Legion activities, recruiting and raffle ticket sales. I would like to have 6-8 members each day so that each member only serves 2-3 hours per day. Sue will have a signup sheet.

I attended the Legion State Convention in Watertown. One consistent message was "Serve our Nation, Build our Nation." We wore the uniform and served our Nation, and now we are building our Nation through Legion Boys State, Baseball, Youth Trooper, shooting sports, veterans assistance, civic events and other Legion programs. The American Legion is Veterans Serving America. We took an oath of service when we entered the military, but we never rescinded that oath at the end of our military service.

Another consistent message was "Be the One." When someone needs to step up for the good of the Legion and fellow veterans, each of us needs to "Be the One," especially when it involves suicide prevention by getting help when it is desperately needed.

No-cost accidental death insurance is available to Legion members, but only if the paperwork is submitted. All of us should take advantage of the no-cost insurance. Higher coverage is available for monthly payments. Decide if the increased insurance coverage is right for you, based on your individual situation. You must maintain Legion membership for coverage. If your membership lapses, the insurance coverage stops. If you then re-instate membership (pay dues), you must re-submit the insurance paperwork for coverage. This is NOT automatic coverage.

LEGISLATIVE NOTES Diane Diekman

Six Democrats and four Republicans said the process for the VA Asset and Infrastructure Review (AIR) Commission was broken and they would not support the slate nominated to serve on the commission, created in the 2018 Mission Act to identify which VA facilities should be closed. The senators' announcement "signifies the end of the AIR Commission." The VA had recommended closing 30 medical centers and 21% of its 800 outpatient clinics. It suggested building new hospitals and boosting reliance on private sector providers. The senators pledged to continue fighting for more VA resources and said the commission is no longer necessary. -

New South Dakota law affecting property taxes for deceased veteran's families: 10-4-41 "\$150,000 of the full and true value of the total amount of a dwelling, or portion thereof, classified as owner-occupied, is exempt from property taxation if owned and occupied by: (1) The surviving spouse of a veteran who was rated as permanently and totally disabled from a service-connected disability; or (2) The surviving spouse of a veteran, who receives dependency and indemnity compensation from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs as a result of the veteran's service-connected death." Counties have different application deadlines, and they are already taking applications for the 2023 tax year.

The Senate is taking up major military toxic exposure legislation after House lawmakers passed corrections to the **Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act (or PACT Act)** to solve technical problems with the measure. The legislation will cost almost \$280 billion over the next 10 years and provide new medical and disability benefits for as many as 20 percent of today's veterans. It is being called the most comprehensive effort ever to address toxic exposure issues in the military. *–Military Times*
