Just returned from the State Convention and trying to stay out of the heat. I spent a day in Aberdeen for Legion Day at Boys State. It was my 1st time at Boys State and it was a great experience. The kids and the staff truly appreciate the blue hats visiting. I encourage you to spend a day at Boys State in 2023. Blue hat day is always Thursday. I also plan to attend Youth Trooper Academy Blue Hat Day in Pierre on June 23. Governor Noem addressed the Legionnaires at the State Convention. She will do everything she can to support Boys State and Girls State. Thank you, Governor Noem, for your support. We also heard from National Commander Candidate Daniel Seehafer, Department of Wisconsin. Dan's message was "Be the One." We all need to look in the mirror and say, "What can I do?" PTSD continues to be our concern. A friend of mine told me a relative of his went to check in at the Emergency Room and took his life at the front door. The staff was not successful in saving him. Suicide has touched many of us in some way. It is so important we do everything we can, not only for our Veterans, but for our non-veteran friends. Sometimes, if we can give someone five more minutes it may be all he or she needs. I tell you this story to say how important Buddy Checks are. A phone call may be all one may need to know you care. Having said that, the Legion passed the following Resolution: "RESOLVED, By American Legion Post 136, in regular meeting assembled in Chester, South Dakota December 13, 2021, That Post 136 recommends the American Legion Department of South Dakota strongly encourages suicide awareness and prevention training at the post level; and, be it finally RESOLVED, That posts are strongly encouraged to seek out qualified trainers and invite them to provide training for their Legionnaires and members of the American Legion Family." Leadership will be working on having someone come to talk to us in the near future about suicide. In closing, thank you all for what you do for the Legion, our Veterans and Post 15. A special thank you to Dale Hill, Barry Andrés, Jim McQuisten, John Bachmeier, Bob Johnson, and also our permanent guest Diane Diekman for taking their time to attend the State Convention. Post 15 came home with 100% American Legion Family Ribbons and was the only Post to receive all 4 ribbons! Thank you all for keeping up the good work. We also came home with 2nd Place for our Newsletter. This is the 1st time we have received this recognition. Thank you to Diane for putting the newsletter together and to everyone for your articles. Reminder that there will not be a Membership Meeting in July. See you in August.

LEGISLATIVE NOTES

The Senate voted 84-14 on June 16 to approve the Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring Our PACT Act, which would extend health care and disability benefits to an estimated 3.5 million veterans exposed to burn pits and other airborne hazards. The bill must still pass the House and be signed by President Joe Biden, but the Senate was the biggest hurdle, and the bill is now expected to pass. South Dakota Senators Thune and Rounds voted against it. --Military.com

Senators from West Virginia, New Mexico, South Dakota, and New Hampshire have introduced **legislation to eliminate the VA Asset and Infrastructure Review Commission**, which has recommended closing numerous VA medical centers and clinics, mostly in rural states, and constructing new ones in regions where veterans are relocating, largely in the South and West. The medical centers slated for closure include areas where the veteran population is expected to decline. The \$2 trillion proposal calls for the VA to reduce services in West Virginia, close two VA hospitals in South Dakota, and shutter three outpatient clinics in New Mexico. --Military.com

Veterans Affairs Life Insurance is a **new VA life insurance policy** for veterans of any level of disability rating. VALife will be launched Jan. 1, 2023, and will be open to all veterans 80 years old or younger who have a disability rating of 0 to 100. Older veterans will be eligible if they applied for VA disability but did not receive the disability rating until after turning 81. It is a guaranteed acceptance whole life insurance with no medical exams or health questions required, but these plans have lower benefits and higher premiums than other life insurance policies. The new insurance policy was created by a bill signed into law in January 2021 called the Johnny Isakson and David P. Roe, M.D. Veterans Health Care and Benefits Improvement Act. -- *Military.com*

Subject: Executive Board Strategic Planning Meetings

Post 15 Officers and Executive Board conducted 2 strategic planning meetings; one on May 16 and another on May 23, 2022 at the Post. We utilized an outside facilitator to help guild us through this process and to help keep us focused. The objective was to look into the crystal ball and have a vision for Post 15 in 3-5 years. After some intense discussions, we decided to focus our activities and efforts on 3 of the American Legion Pillars — Americanism, Youth, and Veterans. It was very clear from our discussions that we cannot be all things to all veterans. We are a volunteer organization, and we need to focus on those areas within each Pillar that we can reasonably accomplish, meaning we focus on those activities that we can get enough member volunteers and have the financial means to support.

We acknowledged the transition over the last few years with the closing of the previous facility (with significant loss of written and financial records in the move to the Alliance, and significant loss of historical knowledge of how some of our programs were run). Even with those setbacks, Post 15 has made it through those challenges and our membership is growing.

With this backdrop, the strategic planning resulted in three areas that the Officers and Executive Board members see as the primary focus over the next 3-5 years.

The first focus area is membership – we need to have <u>more membership</u> <u>engagement</u>. There is a small core of members who do 95% of the work. We ask that each member contribute in any way that they can – some of our older members may only be able to help by attending membership meetings, social dinners, pancake breakfasts, and some only by maintaining membership. We need more members to help at pancake breakfasts, Honor Guard, Color Guard, raffle ticket sales, cemetery flags for Memorial Day, gun shows, and Legion baseball games. We need help at Benson's Flea Market, Sioux Empire Fair, and other public venues to help get the message out that the Legion is NOT a bunch of old guys at the bar. Some volunteering is as simple as directing traffic and parking at car show events that the Post receives a donation for. If we have more members helping, even for a few hours per year, or only with specific projects, it will make a <u>BIG</u> difference.

We need to make sure that we have activity co-chairs - it often takes more than one person. Each person takes care of one part of the activity instead of one person getting burned out by trying to do everything. Our biggest challenge is when the Post membership decides to support an activity, we must know <u>WHO IS WE!!!</u> The membership roster does not list any member with the name <u>WE</u>.

If you have special talents that you could contribute to Post 15, let us know. We sometimes need expertise for legal, accounting, fund raising, cooking, grilling, building maintenance, automotive repair, light yard work or other talents or areas of interest. Call the Legion office at 605-336-3470 to let us know how you might be able to help the Post and other members.

Establishing special interest groups somewhat based on age and military conflicts members were involved in was discussed. The objective is to find more common ground among members, and to plan more focused activities for each special interest group - firing range, archery, fun runs, obstacle course, golf league, etc. Do you have additional ideas?

The last area of membership that we need to focus on is retaining our current members and recruiting younger members by doing some of the above items.

The second primary focus area is <u>maximization of resources</u>. This means that we make the best use of our members' time and talents without burning them out. We also need to make the best use of our facilities, such as use of meeting rooms, use of the Alliance for pancake breakfasts, and perhaps sponsor more dances (with different types of music for the different age groups). We don't need to hit a home run on every project – ball games are won with singles, doubles, a few triples and the occasional home run!

We need to focus on the financial aspects of each project that we decide to participate in – how will we pay for this activity; do we need to do additional fund raising for this project? Post 15 is in a good financial position at this time, but we are also in uncertain financial times. We need to ensure that the Post maintains a good financial condition.

The third area of focus is our <u>programs and events</u>. We need to greater utilize our organization partnerships with other veterans group and the community. We need to be in front of crowds at the appropriate time – there are many groups competing for donations, and the Legion needs to continue to present a positive image to the public. We need to prioritize how we request donations and how we spend that money. Boys State, Legion baseball, shooting sports, support for deployed troops are areas that were discussed.

We also have a need for improving the annual/monthly event planning for better utilization of time and resources. This includes better tracking of events and volunteer hours to help with required activity/hours reports to state and national.

Please contact any of the officers or executive board members if you have additional ideas for improving of Post 15.

CONSTRUCTION TO START ON ROAD LEADING TO STATE VETERANS CEMETERY

During the 2021 and 2022 legislative sessions, the South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs received funding to pave the road leading to the state veterans cemetery from the south. The road will improve access to the cemetery.

During construction, all traffic going to the cemetery will need to access the cemetery entrance from the north coming off 258th Ave.

Work will be starting next week and the targeted date for completion of the road project is the end of November 2022.



To access the cemetery during construction when traveling I-90 Westbound: Take exit 402. At the intersection turn right (north). Travel northbound reaching 258th St. Turn left (west). Traveling westbound, turn left at 477th Ave. (South). Follow 477th Ave. until you reach the entrance of the South Dakota Veterans Cemetery to your right.




To access the cemetery during construction when traveling I-90 eastbound: Take exit 399. Stay left. Travel northbound on Cliff Ave. to 258th St. At the intersection turn right (east) on 258th St. Traveling eastbound turn right at 477th Ave. (South). Follow 477th Ave. until you reach the entrance of the South Dakota Veterans Cemetery to your right.

CEMETERY ROAD (CONTINUED)



To access the cemetery during construction when traveling northbound or southbound on I-29: Take exit 86. Travel eastbound on 258th St. Traveling eastbound turn right at 477th Ave. (South). Follow 477th Ave. until you reach the entrance of the South Dakota Veterans Cemetery to your right.



To access the cemetery during construction when traveling I-229 north-bound: Continue north on I-229 until it ends and Jim Zweep Highway begins. Follow Jim Zweep Highway to 258th St. Turn right (east). Follow 258th St. until you reach 477th Ave. Turn right at 477th Ave. (South). Follow 477th Ave. until you reach the entrance of the South Dakota Veterans Cemetery to your right.
