LEGISLATIVE NOTES Diane Diekman

By unanimous consent, the U.S. Senate approved a bipartisan bill to extend VA health care to more veterans who suffer from toxic exposure. It is a pareddown version of legislation introduced in both the House and Senate but deemed too pricey. The bill garnered criticism from some who say it doesn't go far enough to help post-9/11 veterans suffering from fatal diseases after breathing in toxins. The bill was endorsed by the American Legion, VFW, DAV, Wounded Warrior Project, and Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans of America. House Democrats are pushing the Honoring Our PACT Act that would designate 23 diseases and would include Vietnam veterans. Republicans have rejected the bill as too costly. —Military.com Status of Bills in South Dakota Legislature SB 41 - Revise appropriation for construction of National Guard Readiness Center in Sioux Falls. An amendment includes a land swap between the state and Sioux Falls Development Foundation. Scheduled for hearing by Joint Committee on Appropriations. **SB 63** - Revise appropriation for road improvements to State Veterans Cemetery and. Scheduled for a hearing by the Joint Committee on Appropriations. SB 197 - Require POW/MIA flag be displayed in Senate and House chambers. Passed by Senate and scheduled for first reading in the House. **HB 1083** – Provide up to \$150,000 property tax exemption for homes of surviving spouses of veterans who died of service-connected disabilities. Passed by House and scheduled for hearing by Senate Taxation.


