The Go-Getters meet the <u>Thursday after the Legion</u> <u>business</u> meeting each month at the Post. Membership dues are due by the end of the year. Of the \$40 dues, the Post gets \$6.50, the rest goes to State and National. If we consider this newsletter, Boys State, baseball, veterans assistance, insurance and all of our daily expenses to keep the doors open, our costs are over \$50 per member per year. Our main income sources are raffle ticket sales and pancake breakfasts. Raffle ticket sales have been a challenge in today's economy. If each member bought one \$20 raffle ticket, our raffle would be sold out for 2023. The money from the sale of the previous Post has been invested with the intent of using investment gains to help offset expenses (without touching the original balance). Like everybody else, investments are not doing as well as hoped for.

We need to look at more fund-raising avenues. 5k and 10k fun runs, hog roast, direct solicitation to area businesses, and direct solicitation to members have been suggested. If you have additional ideas and experience in running events, please let us know. Financially, the Post is OK at this time. We want to keep our Post financially strong to be able to continue our current programs. Without additional income sources, we cannot maintain our strong programs at the current level of funding in future years.

If you are able to commit a fixed dollar amount to support the Post for the next 5 years, or if you can leave a donation to the Post in your Will, please do so. We need a strong Legion Post to help support our younger veterans. Let us treat them better today than we were treated years ago. Thank you to all members who donate their time to support our Post.

LEGISLATIVE NOTES

When the 117th Congress convenes January 3, it will include 91 military veterans, the lowest total since at least World War II. In 1973, nearly three in every four members had some type of military service. In 2023, it'll be about one in six members. However, the number could grow in coming years. Of the 79 lawmakers elected to the 117th Congress who are 45 or younger, 21 served in the military. Here's a look at the 91 total veterans in the 117th Congress: • 17 in the Senate, 74 in the House. • 28 Democrats and 63 Republicans • 13 served in the military in the 1960s or earlier. • 50 served in the military after 2000. • More than half (49) had overseas combat deployments. • 15 are first-time lawmakers. • 6 are women, a decrease of 1 from last Congress. • 12 states have no veterans in their state delegations. More than 200 veterans were on congressional and gubernatorial ballots in the midterm election, more than any election since 2012. -Military Times

The South Dakota Veterans Council is pushing for two laws to be modified in the next South Dakota legislative session. Both are American Legion resolutions. First is an effort to codify into law the minimum number of Veteran Services Officers (VSO) in each county: one fulltime VSO for veteran populations 1,000-3,999 and one for each additional 4,000 veterans. This would force Minnehaha County to hire two more VSOs to handle its 13,000veteran population. (Pennington County currently has three for its 12,000 veterans.) Beadle County and Meade County would each be required to hire a second VSO. Second is an amendment to the recently passed law that exempts the first \$150,000 in property taxes for owned residences of 100% disabled veterans or their surviving spouses. The amendment would add those 70-90% disabled to the property tax exemption.
