# **LEGISLATIVE NOTES**

# Diane Diekman

President Joe Biden on September 30 signed a **stopgap funding bill into law, preventing a government shutdown** on the last day of the fiscal year. The continuing resolution keeps the government funded through Dec. 16. The Senate approved a short-term government funding bill on Sept 29 and the House passed the measure on September 30. The continuing resolution will allow the government to remain funded at the current spending levels, as lawmakers work to pass Fiscal Year 2023 funding bills

The Senate hopes to advance its measure in mid-November, with negotiations between House and Senate lawmakers on the separate drafts completed in early December. The Senate version outlines \$817 billion in Defense Department spending policies and priorities for fiscal 2023. In July, House lawmakers advanced plans for an \$840 billion authorization bill. The two versions contain significant differences, with both far above the \$770 billion defense budget proposed by the White House in the spring. Senators adopted 75 noncontroversial amendments to their bill draft, including adding authorization legislation for the Coast Guard, State Department and several other agencies. *--Military Times* 

President Joe Biden has signed the **Supporting Families of the Fallen Act** into law. It increases Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance and Veterans' Group Life Insurance benefit coverage from \$400,000 to \$500,000. SGLI and VGLI coverage amounts have not been updated in 17 years. Service members and veterans who choose the new \$500,000 coverage will pay about \$6 more per month for their premium than under the \$400,000 plan. The Veterans' Group Life Insurance is open to veterans who previously had SGLI.
